

Traditional spelling of final or little ʷ(y) is a circle above the preceding syllable. There is also an (sk) final ʷ. Some of the following more traditional Moose Cree characters are used in the *Spoken Cree* texts for example.

Note: If you choose to not indicate vowel length, then you will write without a dot on top of the character. For example pi and pî will both be written pi ᐃ̇. Some roman orthographies use sh instead of š.
